This term, we will be focusing on the season 'Spring' and how our beautiful world is growing and changing all around us. Furthermore, we will look closely at how we change and grow whilst understanding the different stages of life we have been through. We cannot wait to take the Reception class to Warriner farm where we will see different farmyard animals, whilst learning about the preparation for the growing season and how to care for crops and animals.



Term 4 Learning

Communication Language

During this term, we will continue to use circle time to understand the importance of listening. We will be listening to and talking about nonfiction texts to develop new knowledge and vocabulary. We will be asking questions to teach understanding. We will become independent to talk through problems and organise activities with our friends.

Personal Social Emotional Development

During this term, we will be sharing our likes and dislikes with each other. Children will be clear with what makes them happy and know what they can do to achieve this. Children will continue to achieve perseverance and resilience independently following the Grange Way.

Physical Development

This term, we will be using our feet to explore different ways of moving - kicking, dribbling and stopping the ball.

Additionally, we will continue gymnastics which focuses on travelling high, low, under and over.



Literacy

This term, we will be writing graphemes and diagraphs, following on from learning our sounds. We will continue to write sentences and begin to 'hold sentences' in which children will learn to remember their sentences. Furthermore, we will continue to consolidate set 1 sounds and begin to tackle the set 2 diagraphs.

Maths

We will continue to build upon subitising numbers, recall number bonds up to 10, measure length, time and height, explore 3D shapes, spatial awareness and notice errors in three part repeating patterns.

Expressive Arts Design

We look forward to drawing pictures based on observations and looking at the different colours in nature. We will be mixing paint to explore new colours and recognise new patterns in the environment.

Understanding the World

We will understand the changes in our lifetime and what happens as we get older. Children will describe images of familiar situations in the past when looking at contrasting images and stories. Furthermore, we will continue to explore countries around the world and the people who live in them. Finally, we will celebrate Easter and learn the Easter story.
