Happy Friday everyone

What lovely weather to end the week on.

It's been another busy week at The Grange with lots going on. Our new Reception students have settled into The Grange Way of Life so well – they all earned a CBG in assembly today for such outstanding positive attitudes and listening to learn.

Attendance is dropping. We are at 96.94% at present. We have had children off school with COVID already. Please be vigilant as this strain is a beastie.

We have started our school improvement and development journey in earnest and staff have already undertaken a lot of training to ensure that we are meeting the needs of our students. The areas of development for the school are listed below in five sections.

School Improvement:

Areas for Development

Leadership and Management:

- For governors to have an accurate understanding of the school's subject effectiveness
- Leaders should ensure that staff have sufficient guidance about what pupils need to learn and remember, including how component knowledge builds over time in all subjects.
- To establish new operational routines and staff structures to incorporate new senior teachers creating a collective endeavour for school improvement and improving delegation and accountability.
- To ensure subject leaders have a clear understanding of how the curriculum and teaching within EYFS form the building blocks of their subject curriculums.
- Ensure subject leaders understand how the delivery of the curriculum has been adapted to meet the needs of SEND pupils.
- LSAs are deployed effectively and deliver interventions to a high standard.
- Mentoring of ECTs/Apprentice TAs and new staff

Quality of Education

- To improve spelling systems (transitioning from Phonics and into LKS2) across the school ensuring progress from all children and application in all subjects
- Ensure that learning for SEND pupils enables them to access learning with increasing levels of independence.
- Develop the Curriculum for Writing
- Secure SPAG subject knowledge
- Use rich texts to inspire good writing
 To establish an explicit and consistent approach to teaching fluency in Maths from EYFS to Year 6
- Embed strategies to improve the accuracy and retainment of x tables, improving attainment in the statutory x tables test
- Teachers use an established assessment system to make accurate judgements about children's learning.

















- Leaders develop a rigorous system of triangulated monitoring of teaching which provides precise evidence for self-development targets.
- Embed Plan Bee materials

Personal Development

- Improve the school's arts and culture provision to increase the cultural capital children are exposed to.
- Further increase pupils' and new staff awareness of school values so that they can talk about them with great confidence and display them at all times.
- For child 'Subject and PD Ambassadors' to be able to positively talk about their subject and inform subject improvements
- To improve the quality of the school's lunchtime and play experience leading to good social development.

Personal Development

- Implement new government guidelines for improving attendance and improving the attendance of children considered persistent absentees.
- Ensure all staff manage behaviour in and around school consistently, incorporating The Grange Way in all aspects of behaviour management.
- To recognise age-appropriate safe and unsafe behaviours including online safety/road safety/stranger danger

Early Years Provision

- To ensure teaching within the EYFS provision establishes firm foundations in literacy and maths that lead successfully into the Year 1 curriculum.
- To create an early years curriculum and establish structured curriculum systems to support children to meet national standards
- To create an EYFS outdoor area that complements classroom systems and supports all EYFS areas of learning in an inspiring way.

As a school, we are hell-bent on never standing still – always looking for things to get better at and ensuring outstanding progress and attainment of our children- always putting them first.


