Introduction

This Survey was administered over a three-week period between 21st March and the 9th April 2022. All children from Year 1 to Year 6 were offered the opportunity to take part. In total, 227 children took part from a possible 275, representing 83% of the school.

The survey was administered using Purple Mash and was carried out using laptops during school time. There are a total of 10 questions. 8 questions are multiple choice with 5 possible responses (strongly agree, agree, neither agree nor disagree, disagree and strongly disagree). The remaining 2 questions required written responses. The survey was designed by the Computing Coordinator.

Questions asked:

1) I enjoy computing lessons?

2) In school, I use a laptop every week?

3) In school, I use Purple Mash every week?

4) I enjoy using Purple Mash?

5) I feel safe when I use laptops and tablets in school?

6) I know what online safety means?

7) I know how to keep myself safe online?

8) I know how to log on to a school laptop?

9) In your work using Purple Mash, what have you been most proud of?

10) Can you think of something you have learnt in your computing lessons?

A full break down of every child's response can be found in the appendix.

<u>Results</u>

221 children (97%) recorded that they either agreed or strongly agreed with the statement: I enjoy computing lessons. 3 children (2%) in the school declared they did not like computing lessons.

117 children (51%) reported that they **use laptops weekly**. 69 children (31%) reported they did not **use laptops weekly**.

123 children (54%) reported they use Purple Mash on a weekly basis. 67 children (30%) reported they do not use Purple Mash on a weekly basis.

219 children (96%) reported they enjoy using Purple Mash. 3 children (1%) reported they do not enjoy using Purple Mash.

211 children (93%) reported they feel safe using laptops in school. 6 children (3%) reported they did not feel safe using laptops in school.

216 children (95%) reported they know what online safety means. 5 children (2%) felt they did not know what online safety means.

218 children (96%) reported they knew how to keep themselves safe online. 4 Children (2%) reported they did not know how to keep themselves safe online.

218 children (96%) reported they know how to log on to a laptop. 3 children (1%) said they did not know how to log on to a school laptop.
