

Term 5 Overview

This EYFStopic, based on the book 'Journey', explores the concept of travel, imagination, and adventure through engaging, hands-on activities. The children will embark on creative and exploratory journeys, making connections between real and imaginary worlds. They will engage in role-play, storytelling, and art, including making hot air balloon models, creating imaginary lands, and collaborating on a class artwork using a special red pencil. Real-world experiences, such as a walk to the local library and a "Come to School on Wheels" day, will enrich their understanding of transport and journeys. Literacy and maths are woven throughout, with activities like writing journey stories, a transport survey, and number bond practice using Numicon. The topic culminates in our end of term Open Afternoon, where children showcase their journey-themed creations and storytelling skills.


children their The will develop skills communication language and through rich storytelling, role-play, and discussions. They will listen to and retell describe their stories, imaginary journeys, and group engage in conversations about different types of transport and adventures. Through questioning, storytelling, and collaborative activities, children will be encouraged to express their thoughts, expand their vocabulary, and build confidence in speaking and listening. Role-play areas such as the garage, car wash, and dress-up corner will provide opportunities for purposeful talk, helping children to use language in reallife and imaginative contexts.

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

This term, children will build confidence, independence, and teamwork through role-play, storytelling, and collaborative activities. They will practice sharing, turn -taking, and problem-solving. Discussions about journeys will help them explore emotions, resilience, and new experiences, while group tasks will encourage positive relationships and cooperation. They will learn about road and bicycle safety.

Physical Development

During the summer term, Mrs SC will be exploring the fundamental movement of jumping in a variety of ways. Mr Dixey will be exploring the use rackets, bats, balls and balloons which will be very exciting!



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Term 5 Learning

Literacy

This term, children will develop early reading and writing skills through daily phonics sessions, storytelling, and mark-making activities. They will listen to and retell stories, explore non fiction writing about transport and safety, and create their own journey themed stories. Through role -play and discussion, children will expand their vocabulary, strengthen their communication skills, and build confidence in expressing ideas through writing and drawing. We will be working on our letter formation daily.

Maths


This term, we will deepen our understanding of numbers to 20 and beyond, practice skip counting in 2s, 5s, and 10s, explore and manipulate 2D and 3D shapes, and develop number stories using addition and subtraction. We will investigate number bonds to 5 and 10 using numicon.

Expressive Arts

Children will create a collaborative artwork using a red pencil, design their own imaginary lands, and make hot air balloon models and collages. Role-play areas, including a garage and a car wash, will encourage storytelling and character exploration. Music, movement, and performance opportunities will help develop confidence and self -expression.

Understanding of the World

In this unit, children will explore journeys, both real and imaginary, learning about different types of transport, safety, and how travel works. Through storytelling, role -play, and creative activities. they will gain an understanding of the world around them and how we move and explore different places .
